Dear Mr. Khan:

Let me begin by extending an apology for the delay in providing you with a written response to your records request. It was believed that this correspondence had been mailed out to you a number of months ago. When your follow-up inquiry was received, it was discovered that a response had not been sent to you. Again, my apologies for this delay. Your request, made pursuant to the California Public Records Act (the Act), seeks records related to predictive policing.

The Los Angeles Police Department (the Department) is cognizant of its responsibilities under the Act. It recognizes the statutory scheme was enacted in order to maximize citizen access to the workings of government. The Act does not mandate disclosure of all documents within the government's possession. Rather, by specific exemption and reference to other statutes, the Act recognizes that there are boundaries where the public's right to access must be balanced against such weighty considerations as the right of privacy, a right of constitutional dimension under California Constitution, Article 1, Section 1. The law also exempts from disclosure records that are privileged or confidential or otherwise exempt under either express provisions of the Act or pursuant to applicable federal or state law, per California Government Code Sections 6254(b); 6254(c); 6254(f); 6254(k); and 6255.

Staff from the Department's Fiscal Operations Division and the Real-Time Analysis and Critical Response Division conducted searches but were unable to locate any records responsive to your request.

Staff from the Department's Information Technology Bureau (ITB) conducted a search and has located documents responsive to your request. One of the documents, "LAPD in 2020" is found online at http://assets.lapdonline.org/assets/pdf/LAPD%20Strategic%20Plan.pdf. The pertinent pages responsive to your request are pages 9,10,19,20, and 57 and they are attached for your convenience. The other responsive document, entitled "Randomized controlled field trials of predictive policing", is also attached. The Department has been unable to locate any additional records responsive to your request. However, ITB staff has provided the following information in response to your request:

#2 - There are no payments made to vendors for predictive policing.

#3 & #8 - The Department has worked with employees of PredPol on implementation and use of software but no payments have been made to PredPol.
