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<b>What were your accomplishments within this reporting period?</b>	During this reporting period we added four more divisions to the Smart Policing Initiative: Foothill, Olympic, Hollywood, and Mission. For each of these patrol divisions, the research partner conducted data analysis to identify hot spot corridors. LAPD's Smart Policing team began to train analysts and officers on creating chronic offender lists and on identifying 'anchor points' within hot spot corridors. (The chronic offender lists include 12-15 violent offenders and the anchor points are specific places that generate or attract violent crime.) To measure dosage more effectively, data from automated vehicle locators are now used. These data allow the Department to determine how much time was spent in each LASER Zone by patrol officers. This is more efficient and accurate than the 'hand counting' of minutes in the zones that were done in the past. For all 12 divisions we are now able to accurately determine how much dosage is occurring within the LASER Zones.
<b>What goals were accomplished, as they relate to your grant application?</b>	Two major goals are being tracked and monitored and will be accomplished over the next six months. The first goal is to reduce violent crimes in the LASER Zones through data-driven techniques. Using data and analytics, the department is able to address violent crime within the areas that are the most violent-prone in 12 divisions and in the city. Similarly, by identifying chronic offenders and tracking their activities, the Department is able to deter them from committing more crimes. The second goal is to institutionalize Smart Policing concepts by implementing LASER throughout the department. This year we have added four more divisions and by 2019 all divisions will be implementing and using this data-driven method.
<b>What problems/barriers did you encounter, if any, within the reporting period that prevented you from reaching your goals or milestones?</b>	No problems or barriers were encountered.

<b>What major activities are planned for the next 6 months?</b>	Over the next six months we will monitor all 12 divisions that are implementing LASER. We will provide additional training and mentoring as needed. With the budget modification, we will create a 'situation room' that will allow the department to centralize activities at Operations-South Bureau. The funds will be used for additional computers, monitors, supplies and equipment to conduct analytics and oversee the LASER divisions.
<b>Based on your knowledge of the criminal justice field, are there any innovative programs/accomplishments that you would like to share with BJA?</b>	Not at this time.
