Predictive Algorithms Part I: Predictive Policing

On Monday March 28th the Stop LAPD Spying Coalition hosted its first teach-in on Predictive Algorithms and Predictive Policing. This is a first in a series that will explore the growing encroachment of predictive algorithms into our everyday lives from policing to social services. <u>Predictive Policing's</u> background is tied to the <u>US</u> <u>military's</u> counter-terrorism and counter-insurgency tactics, with data driven warfare and occupation now equivalent to data driven policing. Simply put predictive policing takes historic crime data and inputs it into an algorithm that computes hotspots of where crime may be committed.

As the teach-in moved through a series of exercises and a powerpoint presentation, the focus centered around "historical crime data." The question posed - "Is historical crime data unbiased?" An at-length conversation ensued around the myth that predictive policing is an unbiased tactic because it excludes sociodemographic data using only historical crime data to make predictions. It was clear in the discussion that historical crime data is biased due to structural racism inherent in the policing model. The over policing and the biased prosecution of people of color especially the Black community is undeniable therefore historic crime data will reflect this reality. The community remarked that it is a method of control and infiltration that over-saturates communities with police. This oversaturation of police leads to more arrest which feeds the predictive algorithm and again leads to more police in the same communities.

We say no to predictive policing! We say no to the harassment and criminalization of our communities. Please stay tuned for our next session on <u>Predictive Sentencing</u>.
