MMCC Executives - I'm writing to let you know that the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) plans on filing an amicus brief in the next few weeks in support of the Cities of Chelsea and Lawrence in their challenge of the President's Executive Order withholding federal funds from "sanctuary cities." ADL filed amicus briefs in similar cases in <u>San Francisco</u> and <u>Santa Clara</u> arguing that the executive order threatens to drive a wedge between law enforcement and immigrant communities and creates an environment in which victims will be afraid to report crimes, including hate crimes. The brief argues that this approach makes all of us less safe. The brief ADL plans to file in Massachusetts will be substantially similar to the briefs filed in California and is being drafted by the law firm, Latham & Watkins.

Situational Overview

We are deeply saddened and troubled by the terrorist attacks that took place in Belgium, Brussels this morning. Two explosions were set off at the Brussels airport, and one at a subway station. As of this writing, according to Belgian media, more than 30 individuals were killed, and approximately 200 wounded.

One of the airport explosions occurred on the tarmac, and another took place near the American Airlines terminal, which appeared to be a suicide bomber outside the security checkpoint. The subway explosion took place at the Malbeek Metro Station, which is just a couple hundred yards from the European Commission headquarters and less than a mile from the U.S. Embassy.

ADL has been in touch with federal authorities, and we are not aware of any specific or credible threat against the American Jewish community. However, vigilance, communication and keen situational awareness are always recommended. It is prudent for

Jewish community organizations to revisit and reassess their security plans, measures and procedures.

We strongly encourage institutions to take the following action steps:

ACTION STEPS

- Connect with local law enforcement to discuss security. If you have not established
 personal relationships with key police personnel, set up a meeting to do so. If you are
 not sure who to reach out to, ADL can help connect you with the appropriate
 personnel.
- Review the <u>Bomb Threat Guidance</u> provided by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and U.S. Department of Homeland Security.
- Ensure that your institution's rules and procedures dealing with who gets into your facility and events are sufficient and are functioning (access control).
- A facility should have as few entry points as possible (ideally one), so that no one is able to enter your facility without being greeted and observed. Be sure to obey all fire codes and ensure adequate routes for exiting the building.
- Suspicious behavior should be promptly reported to the police or security personnel. See ADL's <u>Guide to Detecting Surveillance of Jewish Institutions</u>.
- Ensure that your staff members, including newly hired personnel, know their role in security and what to do in the event of an emergency.
- Suspicious packages and strange devices should be promptly reported to the police or security personnel. See the <u>FBI Advisory</u> on what to do if you receive a suspicious letter or package.
- Ensure that existing safety devices (video cameras, lights, walkie talkies, etc.) are in good working condition.
- Refer to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's guidance on how to respond to an Active Shooter: DHS Active Shooter Pocket Card
- Refer to ADL's list of <u>Considerations for Digital and Online Security at Jewish Institutions</u>.
- Refer to ADL's list of <u>18 Best Practices for Jewish Institutional Security</u>.
- Trust your instincts. If something strikes you as being out of place or problematic, call the police <u>immediately</u>.

Security is a long-term process that cannot be efficiently or effectively deployed only when there is a bulletin, advisory or alert. It is important to review security procedures on a regular basis and to always be thinking of ways to improve security.

This initiative is part of a larger global BDS (boycotts, divestment and sanctions) movement that is, in significant part, dedicated to Israel's delegitimization as the Jewish state. Groups backing this resolution have offered other justifications for the HP boycott, but it remains clear that this effort is designed primarily to target and delegitimize Israel.

As of today we have not seen a copy of the resolution. The rules of the Cambridge City Council do not require them to publish the resolution until 3:00 pm on Thursday, April 19. While some members of the Council have seen a draft resolution, the proponent organizers have – we are told – shared it with them on the condition that it not be made public. This seems to us to be a cynical effort to prevent an honest and open public debate prior to a significant action by a public body.

We call upon our community to mobilize and take action.

For both residents and non-residents of Cambridge:

- Mark your calendar: Make a commitment to be at Cambridge City Hall on Monday, April 23 at 5:30 pm to demonstrate your opposition to this resolution and to testify against it before the City Council. Your presence is important, even if you do not testify.
- Anyone can testify; advance online registration is recommended. To receive notification (from us) when the Council's online sign-up is live, and for other updates in the week ahead, write to us at boston@adl.org.
- **Contact your friends** especially those in Cambridge. Share this alert and ask them to take action as well.

If you are a resident of Cambridge:

- Contact the City Council and urge them to reject this effort to single out Israel for demonization. Please communicate to them respectfully but firmly and let them know that as someone who is concerned about the city you live in and its public image, this resolution will have implications beyond Hewlett-Packard and, if adopted, would tarnish the reputation of your city. Tell them:
 - The Cambridge City Council should not abdicate its
 responsibilities to an interest group whose purpose is to demonize
 Israel. Any resolution of this kind deserves a full and fair public
 hearing, including inviting experts and interested parties to weigh
 in openly before action is taken.
 - Singling out Israel and HP, amongst all the nations, companies, and conflicts in the world, and holding them to a unique ethical standard raises troubling issues about the Cambridge City Council. Thousands of American companies are working overseas and engaged in transactions that can be tied to questionable human rights practices; including numerous companies with Cambridge contacts.
 - It would be one thing if the Cambridge City Council elected to adopt a foreign policy that it applied without prejudice to nations and companies around the world. However, in this instance, the Council is overlooking scores of other situations and electing to support dubious and largely unexamined claims against Israel made by an outside organization.
 - The BDS movement is detrimental to achieving peace. The
 establishment of a Palestinian state is a goal we share, but will not
 be realized by extreme and deceptive claims that belie the hard
 reality on the ground. There are many people of goodwill, who are
 working to bridge the divide between Israelis and Palestinians.
 Boycotts, like the one under consideration, undermine these

peacemakers, fuel polarization, and strengthen the hands of those who reject co-existence.

Now is the time to make your voice heard.

We cannot underscore how important it is the members of the Cambridge City Council hear from our community about this. Together we can send the message: This action would be wrong for Cambridge and does not advance the prospects for achieving a lasting peace.

Subject: ADL Israel Trip Departure Logistics

Dear Fellow Israel Travelers,

We hope everyone is getting excited for our upcoming trip to Israel. Our time on the ground will be full of police and intelligence briefings, site visits, and touring of the major religious sites throughout the country. The detailed itinerary will be distributed upon our arrival.

Everyone should have received an email with your electronic ticket. If you did not receive your ticket, please let Talia know ASAP. Flying time is about 10 hours so dress comfortably and bring noise cancelling headphones and/or a neck pillow if you have them. The flight is currently full. You might also want rent – in advance – a few movies on a tablet/computer for the flight as well. EL AL flights have a digital streaming entertainment system that they call Dream Stream. Essentially using a tablet, phone or computer you can watch movies, TV shows etc. It works best with a tablet. However, you must download the app before you board the plane.

The trip includes a visit to the Western Wall where there is a long tradition of <u>placing notes</u> which serve as a message or prayer to God. Robert's children often write a note that he brings with him in a ziplock bag and then leaves the notes at the wall during the visit. People of all faiths do this – it is by no means exclusive to Jews. We only raise this in case you are interested in this tradition and want to include participation from your family. It's best if you use very small pieces of paper that are folded tightly. We will discuss the tradition in greater detail when we tour the area.

American dollars are widely accepted and ATM's are on every corner just as they are in the US. It is easy to obtain Israeli currency directly from an ATM. Please check with your cell phone carrier to be sure you will have international voice and data. WhatsApp is an excellent smartphone app that allows you to text and make calls for free over the internet. Israel is 7 hours ahead of Boston. All of the hotels have internet, gyms, and business centers and the bus we will travel on has Wi-Fi.

We will provide everyone with some articles to read on the plane but as the trip draws closer you might considering checking out <u>The Times of Israel</u> which is a free online English newspaper. It is a good unbiased source to get a sense of what is happening on the ground.

Please plan to arrive at Logan Airport at **6 PM on Sunday, December 4th.** We will meet at the <u>EL AL</u> check in counter in Terminal E. We have been in contact with <u>EL AL</u> security and they are expecting us which should make check in easier. You can check in but please do not proceed past security without checking with us first. We should proceed together once everyone has checked their bags and been cleared by EL AL security. We will gather for a short briefing before we board the flight.

We arrive at 2:45 PM on Monday and will be met by Reuven Solomon, our English speaking guide and our ADL colleagues who live in Israel. Reuven has lead every law enforcement trip and is among the country's top guides. From the airport we will go directly to the <u>Carlton Hotel</u> in Tel Aviv where there will be an opportunity to rest and/or take a walk or run along the Mediterranean before our opening dinner. The hotel is directly on the beach.

Though we do not expect snow, it is still fall, so bring along a fleece and light weight rain jacket. We have also found that a pair of water proof sneakers are ideal given the sometimes unpredictable weather and amount of walking we typically do. Please check the weather in Tel Aviv, Jerusalem, and Tiberius.

Additionally, we wanted to make you aware of an organization called Jewish Voice for Peace (JVP), which seeks to demonstrate Jewish opposition to the State of Israel and to steer public support away from the Jewish State. See more, here. JVP's campaign, "Deadly Exchange," is their latest project, a propaganda campaign that asserts that joint training and exchange programs between American and Israeli law enforcement agencies are responsible for rising levels of police brutality and racism against minorities in the U.S. To quote their website, in such law enforcement exchange programs, "'worst practices' are shared to promote and extend discriminatory and repressive policing in both countries including extrajudicial executions, shoot-to-kill policies, police murders, racial profiling, massive spying and surveillance, deportation and detention, and attacks on human rights defenders." We would like you to be aware of this, should they reach out to you. Please let us know if you need any additional information.

If you have any questions or concerns or are running late on your way to the airport, please call Talia on her mobile number . We are looking forward to seeing each of you next Sunday.

Subject: ADL Trip to Israel - Important Information

Good Afternoon,

Welcome to the 2017 New England Counter Terrorism Seminar in Israel. We are a strong delegation and we are honored to be traveling with each of you. Our departure for Israel is just under one month away and we have some additional details to share with everyone:

Flight Information:

- 1) We will meet at the <u>El Al</u> check in counter at Logan Airport Terminal E on Sunday, December 3rd at 6:00 PM. Please do not proceed past security before checking in with me. We are on a non-stop flight departing at 9 PM and the flight usually boards 1 hour before it leaves. El Al has its own security procedures which sometimes add time to the check in process. If you are running late, please call Talia her cellphone is ______.
- 2) The flight from Boston to Tel Aviv is about 10 hours, so dress comfortably and consider a pair of noise cancelling headphones. The aircraft we are traveling on has entertainment but does not have individual screens in the seat backs. They do have a digital streaming entertainment system that they call Dream Stream. Essentially using a tablet, phone or computer you can watch movies, TV shows etc. It works best with a tablet. However, you must download the app before you board the plane. We strongly recommend you download the app and make sure your device is fully charged. You can find the app in both the Google and Apple App stores.
- 3) As a reminder, if you are traveling on a "red" US Government passport, you will require a visa to enter Israel.

 Americans traveling on personal "blue" passports do not require a visa. If you need help connecting with the Israeli Consulate please contact Talia.

Preparing for the trip:

- 4) If you have not sent us your bio and head shot, please send it in. We need a bio from everyone. Jake will be following up with everyone next week.
- 5) Israel is 7 hours ahead of Boston.
- 6) Attached is a participant list, hotel contact information with corresponding dates, and a suggested packing list. Israel is an informal country so there is no need for suits or ties. In addition to the items noted, I suggest a pair of 511's and waterproof sneakers. Hopefully, we will not encounter any rain, but the weather in December is sometimes unpredictable. Other important items include sun glasses and a light fleece jacket windproof is ideal.
- 7) Contact your mobile phone provider to verify that your phone will work in Israel. Virtually all American smartphones work in Israel seamlessly but sometimes the provider needs to know in advance of your travel plans. It can be expensive if you don't sign up for a plan in advance.
- 8) ATM's are as abundant in Israel as they are in America and there is no need to change money in advance. Most places and shops take US currency and credit cards.
- 9) Please bring patches, pins, challenge coins and caps for the Israel Police (it is very likely they will have the same for you).
- 10) We do not release a detailed itinerary before we travel since many meetings and visits are subject to change based on schedules and changing circumstances on the ground. However, here are a few details to help you prepare:
 - a. Our first night is in Tel Aviv and the hotel is about 40 minutes from the airport.
 - b. Each person will have their own room. The hotels have internet service and gyms, and are in locations conducive and safe for running.
 - c. We have one of Israel's best guides, Reuven Solomon, who has extensive experience with law enforcement and has served as the guide for this trip since 2008.
 - d. The trip will include a training component as well as touring including the critical religious sites.
 - e. ADL maintains an office in Jerusalem which coordinates all of the logistics and meetings and some of our staff will join parts of the trip.
- 11) If there are sites or places that you know you want to visit please let us know and we will do my best to make that happen. If you have contacts, friends, or colleagues in Israel and want to see them, please let us know. We will have

law enforcement guests at some of the dinners and we can always accommodate a couple of additional colleagues or friends.

We will send out another email with more details on what to expect upon arrival in the next week or so. Please do not hesitate to call Talia with any questions or concerns. We are looking forward to traveling with each of you next month.

You may wish to draw special attention of patrols to synagogues and Jewish institutions at these times:

- Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year) will begin at sundown on Sunday, October 2nd and last until sundown Tuesday, October 4th.
- <u>Yom Kippur</u> (the Day of Atonement) will begin at sundown on <u>Tuesday, October 11th and last until</u> sundown Wednesday, October 12th.

While Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are the most widely attended Jewish holidays of the year, Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah, which take place from October 16th to October 25th, also may attract a higher number of worshippers. It is also worth noting that the traditional huts built outdoors during the festival of Sukkot may be a target for vandalism.

Many of you know of my personal commitment to policing in Massachusetts and ADL's gratitude for your service and sacrifice to keep us safe, which is why I wanted to reach out to you individually about an email you may have received or heard about supporting police reform.

ADL is part of a coalition supporting many aspects of police reform, particularly, implementation of POST. I recognize that the language and inferences in our email were offensive to many of you and the people who serve under you. I take responsibility for this and apologize. It was not intended to be an indictment against the profession or any officer/dept/agency.

I am grateful to the many Chiefs who reached out to me directly, expressing their profound disappointment. One Chief described how they felt "abandoned" by ADL, while another explained how the language perpetuated an inaccurate narrative. I want to be clear that we are not abandoning Massachusetts law enforcement and consider you to be invaluable partners and a linchpin to American democracy.

In the past three months, ADL has hired two former FBI ASAC's to assist with our law enforcement initiatives. They bring decades of on the job experience and expertise. We have also updated our hate crime and extremism training programs/modules which are available to all Massachusetts police agencies.

I am available to discuss this in greater detail offline, but want to express my deep appreciation for your commitment. ADL's working relationship with law enforcement dates back decades and we look forward to partnering in the years and decades ahead.





Dear Rob and Mitch,

I would like to introduce you to one another via email. Mitch – Rob is an attorney and a longtime civil rights advocate and the director of the New England Regional Office of the Anti-Defamation League. Rob – Mitch is the Executive Director at Common Purpose and has many years of experience facilitating batter intervention programs for abusive men who have gone through the criminal justice system. I really appreciate both of you agreeing to serve on the task force to review and revise the curriculum developed in 2000 for the Diversity Awareness Program mandated for hate crime offenders convicted under M.G.L. c. 265, §39.

I converted the PDF of the curriculum to a word document to allow for an easier editing and commenting process. I had to reformat and edit it quite a bit to get it into good enough shape to work on substantive edits, so I apologize for the delay. That general editing process will need some further work, but editing the content is the current priority for this project at this time. I have attached the document to this email for your review. I wrote in several comments and questions about issues I noticed myself, but the curriculum will need a comprehensive review beyond the issues I have identified.

Mitch – Rob will be away for the next couple of weeks. We discussed setting up a meeting in person on Friday, July 24, 2015. Would this work for you?

In the meantime, it would be great if you could both look at the curriculum and come up with your own impressions and suggestions. I will continue to work on identifying and reaching out to people to join this project and will keep you informed of any updates on that front. I am also working on compiling some additional resources that might be helpful for reference. I believe the ADL and Facing History and Ourselves have curricula that will be helpful to use for reference, especially to identify useful supplemental materials. I have also reached out to a professor at Northeastern who has conducted research on similar programs that were offered in the past in other states (my understanding is that these programs are not currently active). I hope he will have some other resources that will be helpful. He may also be someone to include on the task force.

I wanted to provide some more information on the project as a whole because the curriculum is just a piece of what I am working on right now. I am sharing this information for your own interest, but you may find it helpful in thinking about the curriculum.

I became interested in this project through my work as victim witness advocate at the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office, where I worked for almost 5 years prior to starting law school this past fall. The Diversity Awareness Program is currently mandated for offenders convicted under M.G.L. c. 265, §39 but has not been implemented. The statute states:

"A person convicted under the provisions of this section shall complete a diversity awareness program designed by the secretary of the executive office of public safety in consultation with the Massachusetts commission against discrimination and approved by the chief justice of the trial court. A person so convicted shall complete such program

prior to release from incarceration or prior to completion of the terms of probation, whichever is applicable." M.G.L. c. 265, §39 (2012).

EOPSS and MCAD developed a curriculum in 2001 which was approved by the Chief Justice of the Trial Court, but the program was never implemented. In addition to working with experts in the community to revise the curriculum, I am also proposing a number of changes to M.G.L. c. 265, §39: for the program to be available to defendants only while serving probation sentences (logistically it will not be possible to offer the program to incarcerated offenders), to designate an agency responsible for enforcement (hopefully probation), and to incorporate a functional funding mechanism. I am also proposing to add a provision under M.G.L. c. 265, §37 (the more general civil rights violation statute) stating that defendants convicted of under the provisions of this section *may* be sentenced to complete the program. (This provision is used in a variety of contexts including hate crimes.)

I am currently working on sorting out the program logistics. In order to determine how to structure the program, I have requested information from the DAs offices in Massachusetts to gather more information about the potential participants and identify the primary areas in which these crimes occur. I have broken down the Massachusetts State Police Hate Crime Statistics to identify the breakdown of bias type among these crimes, and I have attached this data for your review. I think it will be important to divide up the curriculum to account for the percentage breakdown. I will be further reviewing the Massachusetts State Police Hate Crime Statistics to breakdown these crimes by area in addition to the information I have requested and will review from the DAs offices. To start out, we will likely pilot the program in one or two locations in Massachusetts which will be selected based on the data. I expect to have more information about this in the next two weeks or so, and I will keep you updated.

Finally, I am working on sorting out funding for this program, which is the most challenging piece of this project. The statute requires convicted offenders to pay \$100 towards a fund for the program. The designated fund for this program was dismantled in 2003. (I do not believe judges are still fining convicted offenders, and if they are, the money would go to the General Fund.) The changes I hope to make to the statute (mentioned above) would only have an effect in the future. We would need funding for the first year of the program at the very least. I hope to have more information about this in the next few weeks as well.

Please let me know if you have any questions or would like any additional information. I can't thank you both enough for your willingness to work on this project. I am really grateful for your help and looking forward to working with you both.

BAKER NOMINATES SAFETY AIDE FOR JUDGESHIP

STATE HOUSE, BOSTON, MAY 15, 2019.....One of the Baker administration's senior public safety officials, who has worked on everything from the opioid crisis to impaired driving, was nominated by Gov. Charlie Baker for a judgeship on Wednesday.

The nomination of Jennifer Queally, undersecretary for law enforcement in the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security, for a circuit judgeship at the District Court was one of two new judicial nominations made by the governor.

Dorchester attorney Michael Doolin, a criminal defense lawyer who has tried over 25 murder cases, was also nominated to the Superior Court.

The Governor's Council met Wednesday afternoon when they scheduled hearings for both new nominees in the coming weeks. The council also unanimously confirmed two of Baker's pending nominees, appointing James Haddad to the Gardner District Court bench and making Jennifer Allen the newest Suffolk County Probate Court judge.

The votes for both Haddad and Allen were 7-0. Councilor Eileen Duff was absent. Haddad has been of counsel at the Worccester firm Glickman, Sugarman, Kneeland and Gribouski since 2003 and a special prosecutor in Worcester District Attorney Joseph Early's office since 2016. He has defended the MBTA and Massachusetts Bay Commuter Rail against allegations of "negligence, civil rights and wrongful retention claims, as well as other theories of liability" 31 times, according to his resume.

Allen, an Ashland solo practitioner who serves on the Metrowest Legal Services board of directors, has practiced a lot of family law handling many divorces, custody cases, alimony, guardianship claims, and restraining orders, and until 2017 was a partner in Ashland firm Catanzaro and Allen.

Queally, who joined the administration at the start of Baker's first term in 2015, previously worked as an assistant district attorney in both Middlesex and Worcester counties, prosecuting over 100 bench and jury trials.

Her nomination to join the District Court bench comes not long after Baker tapped his deputy legal counsel and the executive director of the Judicial Nominating Commission Sharon Casey for a clerk magistrate post in Cambridge.

As undersecretary for law enforcement, Queally wrote in her resume that she provided strategic leadership for office of grants and research, the Municipal Police Training Committee and the Massachusetts State Police.

She has also testified at numerous legislative hearings on behalf of the administration and sat on multiple special commissions, including groups that worked with the Council of State Governments to develop criminal justice reform recommendations and another that focused on impaired driving after the legalization of marijuana.

Queally graduated from Vanderbilt University and earned her law degree from Boston College. She lives in Weston.

Doolin is also a Boston College graduate, though he spent his undergraduate years in Chestnut Hill before earning his law degree from New England School of Law and going to work for two years as a prosecutor in the Suffolk County District Attorney's office.

He then went into private practice in Dorchester, and has tried cases in the state District Courts and Superior Courts, as well as U.S. District Court. In 1995, Doolin was added to the state's list of public defenders qualified to handle murder cases.

Queally will go before the Governor's Council for questions on May 29 at 9 a.m., while Doolin will have to wait until June 5 at 11 a.m. for his turn with councilors.





Cambridge City Council (CCC) Resolution to Boycott HP
Should the City of Cambridge Become an Instrument of the Global BDS
Movement?

April 23 Hearing Postponed --- But Must Sustain Respectful Advocacy

For the last week, an intensive effort has been underway to consult with members of the Cambridge City Council about a resolution that invites a boycott of Hewlett Packard (HP) because of business done with Israel. The initiative is being proposed by Mass Against HP (MAHP), a working group of "Jewish Voice for Peace," an organization that is part of the international BDS (Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions) movement, which, in the words of its leaders, is dedicated to Israel's destruction.

Hundreds of people have responded by reaching out to Cambridge City Councilors to explain why the proposed resolution is morally and politically bankrupt. We have been gratified to learn that some of the City Councilors have heard us, and the resolution to boycott HP will not be put to vote on April 23rd. An effort is now underway to fashion an alternative resolution that affirms a commitment to the protection of human rights, but steers clear of bigoted attempts to single out Israel or any other country. We are hopeful that the result will be legislation that we can support. However, we are not there yet. It is important that we RESPECTFULLY continue to press our case and encourage a responsible resolution.

Please note: We will not be attending the meeting on Monday April 23rd, and testifying on this matter will not be possible since it is not included on the agenda. We will keep you informed in the days to come as the new hearing date -- likely to be in the next two weeks -- is finalized.

Notification will be on a Thursday afternoon in advance of the regular Monday Cambridge City Council meeting.

Until then, it is important to keep up your respectful outreach and advocacy:

- Inform ourselves by reviewing this fact sheet and these more <u>detailed</u> talking points.
- Contact all 9 city council members to send our letter, or create your own and contact the council members individually to RESPECTFULLY share your concern about this resolution. Remember that many council members have been working hard on this issue for the past week or more.
- Reach out to friends and neighbors. Forward this email and urge them to join you.
- Contact your Rabbi or other organizational leaders and ask them to mobilize their membership.
- Attend the hearing, likely on April 30th, and bring concerned friends whether or not you choose to speak.

NEW REPORT FROM ADL PROVIDES AN IN-DEPTH LOOK AT THE CURRENT STATE OF AMERICAN WHITE SUPREMACY

New York, NY, October 9, 2018 ... ADL has unveiled a new and comprehensive report that examines the current state of white supremacy. "New Hate and Old: The Changing Face of American White Supremacy," produced by ADL's Center on Extremism, is a deep dive into the forces behind this deadly ideology -- from the emergence of the alt right to the ongoing threat posed by more established elements of the movement.

Among the contents of the report: a close look at the increasing use of <u>podcasts</u> by white supremacists to spread their hate, extremists' internal debate over <u>"optics"</u> and the staggering statistics behind <u>white supremacist</u> violence.

"We need to take this threat very seriously and be proactive in combating it," said ADL CEO Jonathan Greenblatt. "Historically, white supremacists have killed more people in the United States than any other type of domestic extremist – and that remains true today. Violence continues to permeate the white supremacist movement."

"White supremacists in the United States have experienced a resurgence in the past three years, driven in large part by the rise of the alt right," said George Selim, ADL Senior Vice President of Programs. "Youth-oriented and overwhelmingly male, the alt right has provided new energy to the movement, but has also been a destabilizing force, much as racist skinheads were to the movement in the 1980s and early 1990s."

According to analysts at ADL's Center on Extremism, some white supremacists, such as neo-Nazis, seem to have been buoyed by the rise of the alt right, while other groups – most notably racist skinheads – appear to have lost potential recruits to the newer strain of white supremacy. The report also examines the political environment that has emboldened the alt right, and recent violence linked to white supremacists.

The report includes a series of <u>legislative and administrative policy recommendations</u> to combat the threat posed by violent, far-right extremists. As part of those recommendations, ADL calls on the United States Congress to enact a domestic terrorism statute that explicitly recognizes and punishes domestic terrorism as a crime, and also asks the federal government to collect statistics on domestic terrorism and other forms of extremist-related criminal activity and to ensure training for law enforcement on best practices to combat domestic terrorism.

BAKER URGES LAW ENFORCEMENT TO ADOPT HATE CRIMES

STATE HOUSE, BOSTON, NOV. 26, 2018....As a group he re-established last year amid reports of a rise in anti-Semitic incidents across New England continues its work, Gov. Charlie Baker last week sent four recommendations from the group to police chiefs and encouraged law enforcement to adopt them immediately.

Based on a recommendation of his Hate Crimes Task Force, Baker suggested that all law enforcement agencies designate at least one officer to serve as the department's point person on all hate crimes and that all agencies should require that officer to report any criminal act that appears to be motivated by bias to a new website the Executive Office of Public Safety is developing.

"The relationship between local law enforcement agencies and the communities they serve is a key component to the effective prevention, investigation and prosecution of hate crimes and, most importantly, to supporting and aiding a victim's recovery," Baker wrote in a letter to police chiefs on Nov. 19.

The governor said the role of the suggested "civil rights officers" would be to "serve as a community liaison and to participate in appropriate community outreach, to review incident reports for potential hate crimes, and to serve as a resource for your agency on any issues related to hate crimes."

Baker also encouraged police chiefs to utilize the National Incident Based Reporting System as their department's primary mechanism for reporting hate crimes to state and federal authorities and to consider adopting the International Association of Chiefs of Police Model Policy as their agency's official policy with respect to hate crimes.

The recommendations came from discussions Baker said he has had with his Hate Crimes Task Force, a group assembled last year to shape the state's policies and practices around hate crimes. The task force was launched after a report of a rise in anti-Semitism in New England. According to the Anti-Defamation League's annual audit of anti-Semitic incidents, there were 177 anti-Semitic acts of vandalism, harassment or assault in Massachusetts in 2017. Anti-Semitic incidents rose by 254 percent over 2015, when the ADL reported 50 such incidents. "Any anti-Semitic act -- any act of hate or terror or violence or vandalism, against anybody or any organization because of their religion, their race, their sexual orientation -- is zero tolerance here in the commonwealth of Mass.," Baker said last month after the mass shooting at the Tree of Life synagogue in Pittsburgh.

In a <u>separate letter</u> last week, Baker asked the Municipal Police Training Committee to work with the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security to develop a comprehensive and specialized training course for civil rights officers. That training will be made available with no charge to local police departments, the governor said.

The Hate Crimes Task Force was first created by Gov. William Weld in 1991 and codified by Gov. Paul Cellucci in 1997 to "advise the Governor and the Secretary of the Executive Office of Public Safety on issues relating to the prevalence, deterrence, and prevention of hate crimes in the Commonwealth." Baker revived the task force last November and tapped Public Safety Secretary Dan Bennett and Boys and Girls Clubs of Boston CEO Josh Kraft to lead the effort. -END-

I have been in touch with an attorney at the Division of Open Government at the Office of the Attorney General who will get back to me next week with a decision on this matter. I will share that with you all as soon as I receive it.

I am sharing this with you now because the OML restricts deliberation over email or outside of meetings, which is a critical component of how we have structured the task force. Additionally, under the OML, all task force meetings including subcommittee meetings would be subject to a range of requirements. I know several of you have already begun dividing up tasks. You may begin working on those tasks individually, but until further notice you should not deliberate with one another. I sincerely apologize for the inconvenience, and I will promptly inform you all of the outcome.

Chapter 69 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 1P the following section:-

Section 1Q. The department of elementary and secondary education, in coordination with the executive office of public safety and security and the Massachusetts governor's hate crimes task force, shall establish a grant program, subject to appropriation, for the education and prevention of hate crimes and incidences of bias in public schools. The grants shall be used for education and prevention programs in school districts for the purposes of education, professional development, prevention, or community outreach. The department shall develop guidelines governing

the implementation of this grant program. In awarding grants, priority shall be given to communities with an identified need.

The Anti-Defamation League (ADL) is pleased to provide you with the dates on which the Jewish High Holidays will fall this year. These holidays are among the most holy in the Jewish religion and their prayer services are among the most widely attended of all the Jewish holidays of the year. You may wish to draw special attention of patrols to synagogues and Jewish institutions at these times:

- Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year) will begin at sundown on Wednesday, September 20th and last until sundown Friday, September 22nd.
- Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement) will begin at sundown on Friday, September 29th and last until sundown Saturday, September 30th.

While Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are the most widely attended Jewish holidays of the year, Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah, which take place from October 4th to October 13th, also may attract a high number of worshippers. It is also worth noting that the traditional huts built outdoors during the festival of Sukkot may be a target for vandalism.

ADL was founded in 1913 to stop anti-Semitism and all forms of hate. ADL works closely with federal, state and local law enforcement across the country to fight hate crimes, extremism, and terrorism, and to protect the Jewish community and all citizens alike.
