Our gang research at UCLA is proceeding well. I am wondering if you have somebody in GND that can answer a data question.

We have been working with some data that occasionally identifies a victim gang and suspect gang associated with individual AGGs and HOMs. These data come from a combination of RACRs sent to the Mayor's GRYD office at the time of the crime and subsequent work by them.

I asked over in COMPSTAT if they had any additional data on gang affiliations tied to individual events. They said that it would only be in the text narratives.

What I am wondering is if GND has such information and/or whether it could be collected. For example, we have a list of about 900 gang-related AGGs and HOMs (MO Code 0906) from South LA (with DRs). 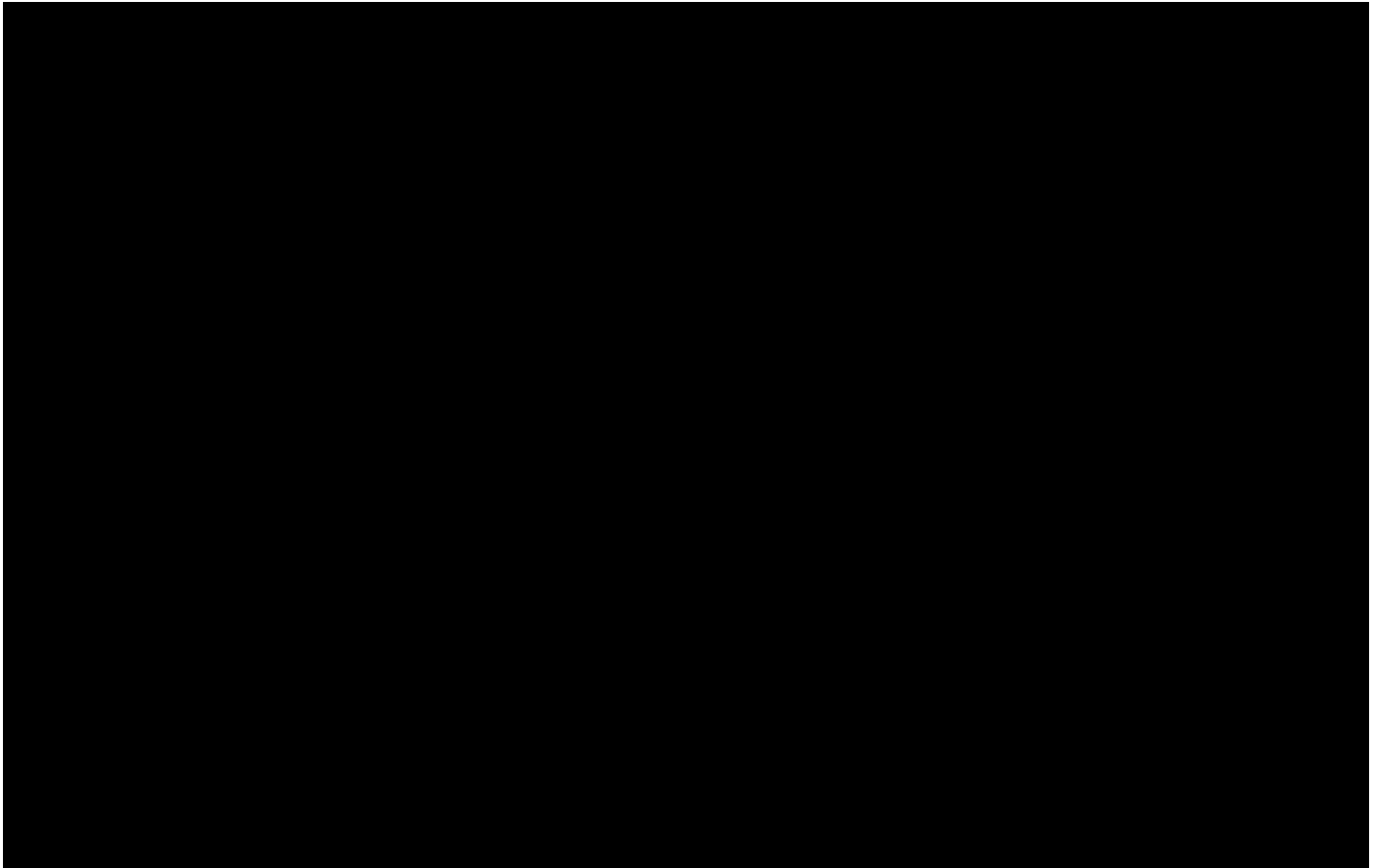

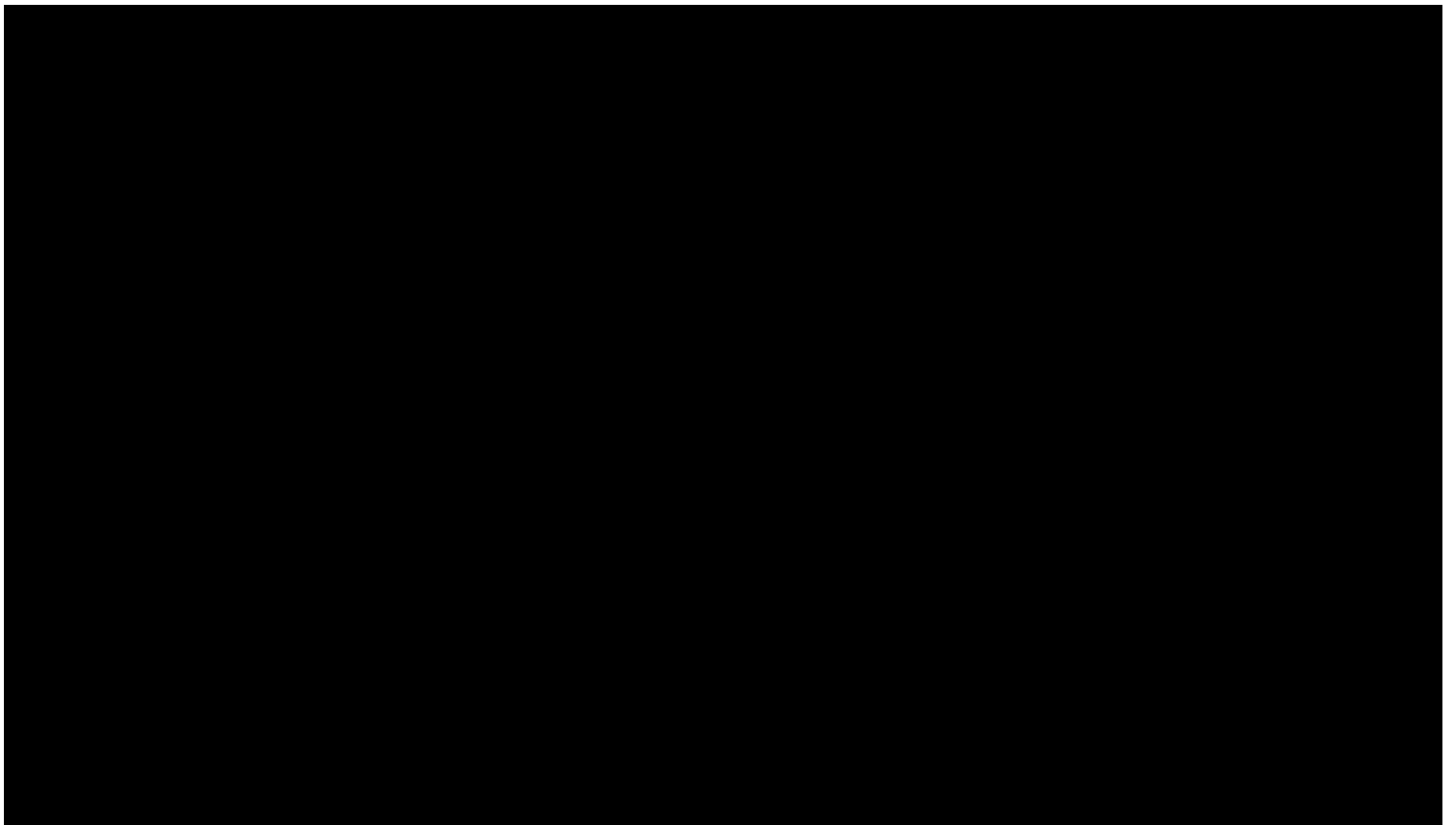

Dear Mike:

Thank you for taking the time to do another data pull. I think we have learned something, but there are still a few things that don't appear to be matching.

I am hoping that you can continue to help with the sleuthing here. I suspect that it may become important for future data processes aside from the specific research questions we are looking at.

Here are the things that I have found:

1. Is it possible that the Incident No in the CRM data corresponds to the last time the record was updated by anybody?

Explanation of question: The incident_numbers in the CRM data are the correct format, but they seem to correspond to something other than the event date or even the reporting date. I noticed that the "status description field" includes things like Adult Arrest and Invest Cont, but nothing that sounds like "initial report". Also there is a field Crime_UPD that I assume means "updated" when it is a "U".

The consequence of this is that the Incident No values, though the right format, do not match any incident numbers in the CFS table.

2. Are we getting crimes that have compound Crime Type Codes?

Explanation of question: I noticed for all crimes that the crime type code is always a single code (e.g., 310). There are no cases of codes being combined, which is something seen in CAMS (e.g., 310 930 = BURG OTH; 310 480 = BURG THEFT).

The consequence is it looks like the number of extracted events is much lower than it should be. For example, for burglary there are about 9000 BURG events for 2016 in the CRM data extracted and there should probably be closer to 12-15k.

Would it help if we just tried to focus on burglaries (any crime including a 310) as a test case?

Craig and I really appreciate your wisdom in helping to solve this interesting problem.

The field labeled as "incident number" in the CRM data is a 9-digit incident number of the form "639982740". This looks different from the incident number in the CFS data, which is a 12-digit number of the form "161025001159".

I've tried all the ways that I can think to line up the two numbers but have failed.

Could I ask for your expertise in setting me on the right track?

I've attached a small snippet of the CRM data so you can see the numbers that I am talking about. Also, in the CRM pull there are nearly 60k events where the incident number is "0".

Hi Mike:

Jeff Brantingham here from UCLA. I believe you and Craig had a sit-down a few days ago to talk about how to generate a database that links DRs back to the originating incidents. This is something I spoke with John Neuman about a few weeks ago and Diane Webber may have emailed you in relation.

If it a feasible process, I would like to request that such a data pull be made. Ideally, this would be for all Part I and Part II DRs in 2015-2016. This would involve maybe 250k DR events, so if it needs to be scaled down that is understandable.

The basic idea for the data can be summarized as this: Given crime in CAMS (e.g., a burglary) can we see what incident was the source of LAPD knowing about the event? For a burglary this originating incident could theoretically be: (1) a call from the victim; (2) a call from a non-victim member of the public; (3) police observed burglary in progress; (4) police observed traces (e.g., broken window) that investigation confirmed was a burglary; or (5) suspect in contact with police for other reason is connected to a burglary that was previously unknown.

It may not be possible to have that much resolution on the originating incident. Distinguishing between public, police and other (as in calls-for-service) may be the primary information available.

I've been doing research for the LA Mayor's Gang Reduction Youth Development Program (GRYD). We have a pretty big finding that we want to try to report in the journal Science. Science is the top journal in the US for all research.

The important finding is:

GRYD's Community Intervention Workers have a major positive effect on reducing gang retaliation.

I know this conclusion might be controversial because of the gray-zone in which CIWs operate.

I want to know what you think about this. Ideally, I would like to **ask you to be an author on the paper** and contribute a little something on how LAPD handles gang shootings and homicides. My impression is that the procedures are the same whether or not CIWs are present. We could do this in conversation and I could write it up. However, joining the paper might be seen as an endorsement of CIWs by the LAPD.

Abstract

A randomized controlled field trial of place-based predictive policing conducted in Los Angeles showed crime reductions when police used algorithmic forecasts compared to controls based on crime analysis best practice. The algorithmic forecasting methods tested did not make use of arrest data, nor did they include personal identifying information, general environmental characteristics or demographic measures as part of forecasting procedures. Rather, forecasts relied only on on the time and location of officially

reported crimes. While the potential for bias may be low given these narrow data inputs, there is still reasonable concern that such methods encourage directed police patrols to target minority communities with discriminatory consequences for minority individuals. Here we test for such biases using arrest data from the Los Angeles predictive policing experiments. We find not only that the numbers of arrests declined or remained unchanged during predictive policing deployments, but also that there were no significant differences in arrests by racial-ethnic group between control and treatment conditions. Arrests also did not contribute significantly to the observed impact of predictive policing on crime.

Does Predictive Policing Lead to Biased Arrests? Results from a Randomized Controlled Trial

Abstract

A randomized controlled field trial of place-based predictive policing conducted in Los Angeles showed crime reductions when police used algorithmic forecasts compared to controls based on crime analysis best practice. The algorithmic forecasting methods tested did not make use of arrest data, nor did they include personal identifying information, general environmental characteristics or demographic measures as part of forecasting procedures. Rather, forecasts relied only on the time and location of officially reported crimes. While the potential for bias may be low given these narrow data inputs, there is still reasonable concern that such methods encourage directed police patrols to target minority communities with discriminatory consequences for minority individuals. Here we test for such biases using arrest data from the Los Angeles predictive policing

experiments. We find not only that the numbers of arrests declined or remained unchanged during predictive policing deployments, but also that there were no significant differences in arrests by racial-ethnic group between control and treatment conditions. Arrests also did not contribute significantly to the observed impact of predictive policing on crime.

Also, asked a Venice Beach Sgt and two officers: Of all the Venice transient locals/regulars, what percentage would you say

know the laws, don't cause trouble, and don't get arrested, and basically mind their own business?

They agreed on about 10%.

So about 10% of the Venice transient population wouldn't have any info in our database.

Would coming up with a survey/questionnaire and have the UCLA students go find and ask transients themselves the questions

And perhaps, it might have to be broke down as this guy is Primary: Addict . Secondary : Criminal.

the lifestyle and efforts made to stop it would be fruitless.

But perhaps, if it is a Bad Luck transient, solutions can be looked at to provide them with resources (getting them to a halfway house,
