

Just wanted to detail the reason for next week's CC with David Kennedy. As you know, Operation Ceasefire has gone through several iterations since its expansion Department-wide. For the most part it has done well, considering the size and magnitude of implementing a program to an organization the size of LAPD. We are, without question, the largest law enforcement agency to undertake this program.

Dear Colleagues,

I hosted a [press conference](#) this morning where I provided the following statement:

*I began my law enforcement career on January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1984. That was the first day of the 63<sup>rd</sup> Basic Police Academy at Gavilan College. Today, after nearly 33 years in law enforcement, I am announcing my intent to retire in early October of this year. I'm 52 years old this year, 53 in October which is retirement age for me. Internally, at the Police Department, I have been discussing retiring in December for the last year. But a few things came up that have caused me to move my retirement date up a few months to October. There are going to be a number of retirements at the end of the year in December, including several Sergeants and Deputy Chief Dan Perez. If I were to leave with that group, there would be a leadership void in the Department.*

*But if I retire in October, the City Manager will be able to start recruiting for my replacement now, get a new Chief in place in October, which will then allow the new Chief to get to know the staff and make his or her own promotions in January, after the rest of the December retirements take place.*

*The police department is well-positioned for the future. Thanks to Measure G we finally have the money necessary to hire more police officers and support staff to implement the important programs we know we can do well, like place-based policing, effective gang violence reduction strategies and community trust building programs. We have the funding for a desperately needed new Police building, one that will not only serve modern law enforcement needs but will also be a positive place for the community to meet and to interact with the officers who serve and protect them.*

*I am confident that a new Chief and the committed men and women of a fully staffed Salinas Police Department will make these programs and initiatives successful.*

*Every day across this city Salinas Police Officers commit acts of bravery and compassion and heroism. And while those acts often go unnoticed by the public at large, they do happen regularly, under challenging circumstances and without expectation of recognition. I cannot tell you how proud I am to work with and lead the men and women of the Salinas Police Department.*
