Hello David and Amy,

Just wanted to let you know that today I had the opportunity to address the entire LAPD Command Staff, Chief included, regarding Mission Area's implementation of Operation Ceasefire. The occasion was the semi-annual Chief of Police Leadership Enhancement and Development Session, Crimefighters Leadership Conference (long title I know). I was able to go through several programs in place at Mission, such as the Repeat Offender Letter, a forum series, we have started in conjunction with Service Providers, to educate the community on Drugs, Gangs, Domestic Violence and Sex Trafficking called the Truth Series and lastly Ceasefire.

All was received well, but I really stressed the benefits of Ceasefire, and how it could easily fit into any of the LAPD 21 commands. I also discussed, and have been very happy with the sustainability of the program, and how after three years it is still having an impact on our violent crime. Being able to inform the group that since the introduction of Ceasefire over 300 individuals have been counseled on the philosophy of the program is a very positive achievement and something I hope generates some outreach.
